Significant Incidents
<p><u>Death Investigation (9/15/23):</u> Death Investigation at 201 Jay St A12: A retired Phillipsburg, NJ Police Sgt., was found deceased in the bathroom by his partner. Anticipated cause of death is anticipated to be a suicide due to the amount of ingested prescription meds. The decedent was living with Multiple Sclerosis and was forced to retire in 2021.</p> <p><u>Robbery (9/18/23):</u> Dunkin Donuts, Stowe Crossing: The employee opened the store at 0357 hours and was met by a 6'2" black male with dread locks, wearing a surgical mask, gray sweatshirt, black pants, and gloves, who threatened the victim with a gun, but one was never displayed. The suspect did have one of the store knives in his hand. A suspect was quickly developed, and arrest is pending identification by the victim.</p>
